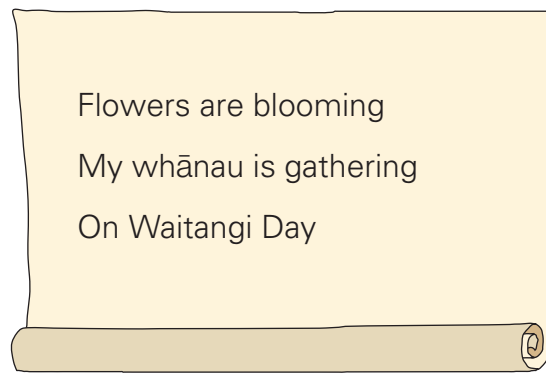
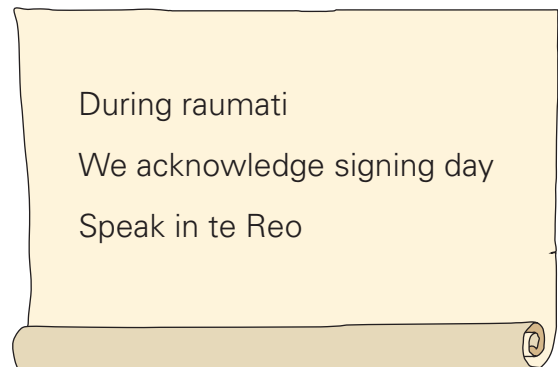
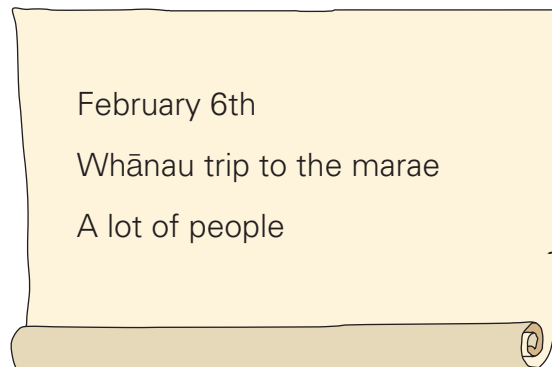


Waitangi Day Poem: Haiku

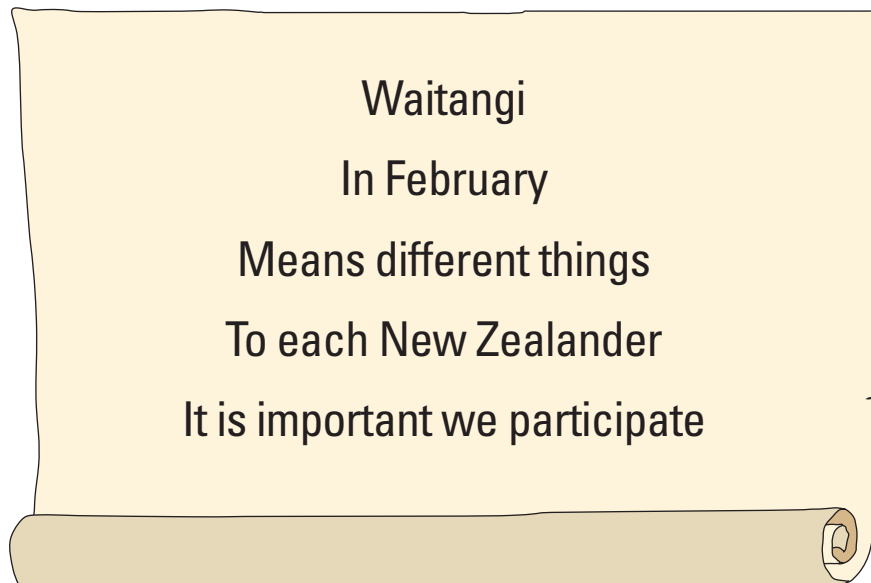
